Preamble

In the digital age creativity becomes “intercreativity”; mostly participatory and distributed by nature.

The recombination of creations is a condition for creativity in the digital world.

Under the pressure of market driven interests, digitisation risks to become privatization, restrained access to digitised resources and further contraction of the public sphere.
